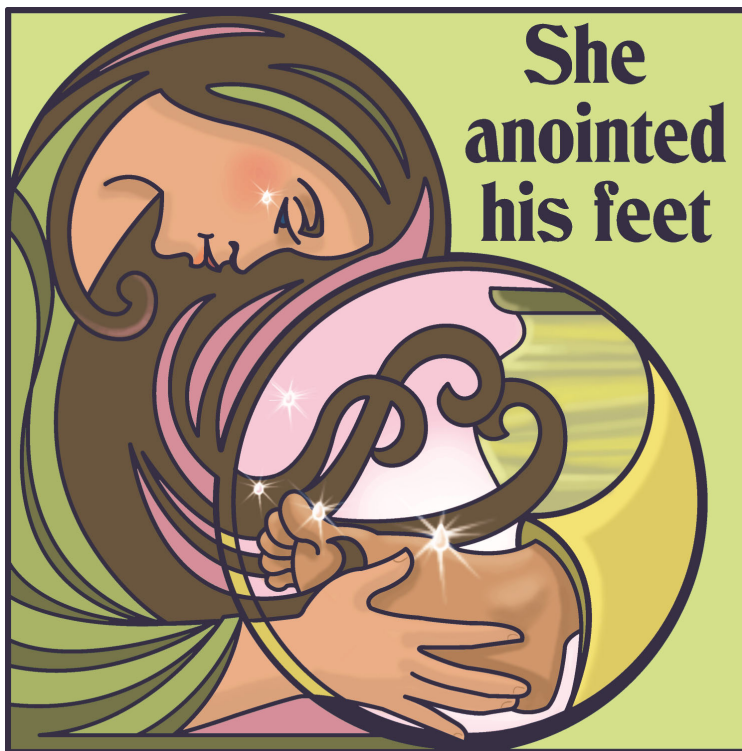

## LOUDER THAN WORDS



In the New Testament the Pharisees and the Sadducees are described as the two main Jewish sects who opposed Jesus' teaching. The Pharisees' refusal to accept Jesus as the

Messiah was one of the root causes of the long, sad, and often violent history between Christians and Jews, persisting even down to our own day. The Sadducees, an elite priestly caste, disappeared after the Romans destroyed the temple in Jerusalem in A.D. 70. The Pharisees continued on, probably because they had more of the "common touch." They interpreted the scriptures for people, believed in an afterlife, and took Judaism from Temple worship to assemblies in synagogues, where they preached and taught from the law and the prophets. It is from the Pharisees that modern Judaism developed. While the Gospels frequently tell how Pharisees tried to trap Jesus with argument and appeals to the law, in today's Gospel Luke tells us about a Pharisee who invites Jesus to his house for a meal. An unnamed woman comes in, washes Jesus' feet with her tears, dries them with her unbound hair and anoints him with oil. Because only prostitutes went about with unbound hair, Jesus' Pharisee friend immediately condemns her as a sinner. Jesus reminds him that, as host, he has not provided his guest with the ordinary gestures of hospitality—washing and anointing before a meal—but this unnamed woman has supplied them. In ancient times sinfulness was thought to cause illness, so the woman may have been a prostitute, or perhaps she was mentally ill or simply a person who was proud, a constant fault-finder, a harsh critic of others. Whatever her actual condition, Jesus is aware—as the Pharisee is not—that she knows her own brokenness and has complete faith in God to make her whole.

## OBRAS SON AMORES Y NO BUENAS RAZONES

El Nuevo Testamento describe a los fariseos y saduceos como las dos sectas principales del judaísmo que se oponen a las enseñanzas de Jesús. La actitud denegatoria de los fariseos para aceptar a Jesús como el Mesías ha sido una de las causas originarias de la larga y triste historia, y a veces hasta de violencia, entre cristianos y judíos, lo cual ha persistido aun hasta la actualidad. Los saduceos pertenecían a una casta elitista de sacerdotes, que desapareció después que los romanos destruyeron el templo de Jerusalén en el 70 D.C. Los fariseos continuaron debido probablemente a que tenían más contacto con el pueblo. Les interpretaban las Escrituras, creían en la resurrección y sacaron al judaísmo del templo hasta las sinagogas, donde predicaban y enseñaban a la asamblea sobre la ley y los profetas. El judaísmo moderno ha devenido de los fariseos. Mientras que los evangelios nos cuentan frecuentemente cómo los fariseos trataban de tenderle trampas a Jesús con sus argumentos y recursos a la ley, en el evangelio de hoy Lucas nos hace un relato sobre el fariseo que invitó a Jesús a comer en su casa. Una mujer, cuyo nombre desconocemos, viene a lavarle los pies a Jesús con sus lágrimas, los enjugó con su cabellera y después los ungió con perfume. Debido a que sólo las prostitutas de la época andaban con el pelo suelto, este fariseo amigo de Jesús inmediatamente condena a la mujer como a una pecadora. Jesús le recuerda que él como anfitrión no ha tenido un gesto de hospitalidad para con su invitado—lavado y unción antes de una comida—pero que esta mujer sí lo ha hecho. Tal vez la mujer era una prostituta o sufría una enfermedad mental. En la antigüedad se creía que el pecado causaba la enfermedad. Quizás era una persona orgullosa que siempre encontraba culpa y criticaba a los demás. Pero, cualquiera que haya sido su condición, Jesús se da cuenta—mientras que el fariseo no se la da—de que esta mujer admite su propio quebranto y tiene completa fe en que Dios puede sanarla.

Praise where it's due

She and Mary Magdalene, with whom she is often confused, along with many other women, were important figures in the private life and public ministry of Jesus. Honor the unsung women in your life who contribute to making the world a better place.

MONDAY, JUNE 13

FEAST OF ANTHONY OF PADUA, PRIEST, DOCTOR OF THE CHURCH

"Tony, Tony, turn around"

The story goes that Saint Anthony—patron of lost objects—had a book of psalms that he treasured. A member of his religious community left and stole the psalter on his way out. Anthony prayed and eventually the thief had a change of heart and not only returned the holy book but also returned to the community! A prayer composed in honor of Anthony goes, in part, "Treasures lost are found again, when young or old thine aid implore." A more informal rendition goes, "Tony, Tony, turn around. Something's lost and must be found." Keep Anthony in mind if you've lost a valued object—or lost something more precious, like faith, hope, or love.

TODAY'S READINGS: *1 Kings 21:1-16; Matthew 5:38-42 (365).* "I am the bread of life; whoever comes to me will never hunger, and whoever believes in me will never thirst."

TUESDAY, JUNE 14

Put on Christ

The U.S. flag is the prime symbol not just of the nation but also of its values. But there are those who engage in "flag waving" or who "wrap" themselves in the flag, dramatic and showy but without an actual, personal commitment to "liberty and justice for all." Without such commitment, pseudo patriotism means nothing. In Colossians, Saint Paul says, "As God's chosen ones, holy and beloved, clothe yourselves with compassion, kindness, humility, meekness, and patience," all rooted in Christ. Can people tell from watching you that you are clothed in Christ?

TODAY'S READINGS: *1 Kings 21:17-29; Matthew 5:43-48 (366).* "But I say to you, love your enemies and pray for those who persecute you."

WEDNESDAY, JUNE 15

Sky's the limit

Mary, the Mother of Jesus, was a human being like the rest of us, but unlike us she was conceived without sin. And unlike any woman, she conceived while a virgin through the power of the Holy Spirit. And at the end of her earthly life, she was taken up, body and soul, into heaven—certainly not an experience the rest of us can expect! She's living proof that nothing is impossible with God. Like her, say yes to God with your

whole being and see what God might do with you.

TODAY'S READINGS: *2 Kings 2:1, 6-14; Matthew 6:1-6, 16-18 (367).* "Elijah went up to heaven in a whirlwind."

THURSDAY, JUNE 16

Thank a truth teller

It may have been a parent, younger brother, or elderly aunt. It could have been a grade-school teacher or college professor or AA sponsor. It may have been your first boss, someone you dated briefly, a roommate, or your oldest and dearest friend. It could even have been a complete stranger you met on a train. Now and again throughout our lives, we encounter people with flaming words to offer us. These words aren't always comforting, and their challenge may burn into our minds and hearts, revealing a painful passage toward the truth. Accept the words, and thank the giver.

TODAY'S READINGS: *Sirach 48:1-14; Matthew 6:7-15 (368).* "There appeared the prophet Elijah whose words were as a flaming furnace."

FRIDAY, JUNE 17

May your eyes be bright

"One day we will learn that the heart can never be totally right if the head is totally wrong." This teaching by Martin Luther King Jr. illuminates the gospel saying about the need for light. If we see clearly, we will know what to do. If we learn to think past opinions and can be motivated beyond personal comfort, we will find our way all the way to the truth. King also said: "Darkness cannot drive out darkness; only light can do that. Hate cannot drive out hate; only love can do that." Love is the lamp that brightens every eye.

TODAY'S READINGS: *2 Kings 11:1-4, 9-18, 20; Matthew 6:19-23 (369).* "The lamp is the light of the eye. If your eye is sound, your whole body will be filled with light."

SATURDAY, JUNE 18

Trust in God

"When we attend to the needs of those in want, we give them what is theirs, not ours. More than performing works of mercy, we are paying a debt of justice." These words, found in the Catechism of the Catholic Church and attributed to Saint Gregory the Great, ask each of us to share what we have with others. It is a profound piece of advice that challenges a "me-first" way of life. It tells us that God thinks that everyone has a right to live in dignity, and you and I have a responsibility to help make that happen. If you can shift the focus away from "getting more," you will find you worry less. Trusting that God will take care of us frees us from anxiety. On this day in the Year of Mercy, take stock of your worries and think about ways to surrender those worries to acts of generosity.

TODAY'S READINGS: *2 Chronicles 24:17-25; Matthew 6:24-34 (370).* "Stop worrying . . . Your Father knows all that you need . . . seek his way of holiness."

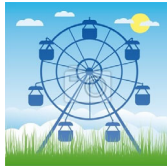
