Third Sunday of Lent

WHAT'S IN A NAME?

Early Christians gave a name to the woman at the well from today's Gospel passage: Photina. It means "she who is enlightened" or "she who has received [the] light." This follows the biblical tradition of bestowing names upon characters to help us understand their role—and ours—in experiencing God's saving power. All of the evangelists, John in particular, make the characters who encounter Jesus prototypes for all of us. Like all of us, Photina doesn't "get it" at first. It takes a dialogue with Jesus (in this case, a rather argumentative one) for her to admit who she is to herself, and for Jesus to help her discover where she might find the true streams of eternal, life-giving water. By the end of the encounter, she is enlightened. Her enlightenment is the reason the early church chose this as one of the Gospels always to be read for those newly seeking Christ, who will be enlightened and initiated in the new paschal light of the Easter Vigil.

NAME OR NO NAME?

Naming the woman at the well has fallen into disuse. In a way, especially for our society, naming things tends to be primarily about making them possessions. People name their pets, their houses, their cars, and so on. It was part of biblical naming tradition that giving or changing a name showed they were in God's possession, but their new names were also chosen to imbue them with the reality of a changed or new direction in life. Most often, today we just name things to show our ownership. So it may be a good thing that we no longer name this woman, for her name could be any one of our names, male or female. She could be—she is—all of us. All of us, in baptism, are named for Christ. We are "christ-ened" and through our life, we bear our most important name: Christian. Lent calls us back to that name, back to a renewed dialogue with Christ, that we might once again be enlightened by the grace of his truth and love.

Tercer Domingo de Cuaresma

EL VALOR DE UN NOMBRE

Los primeros cristianos dieron un nombre a la mujer que estaba junto al pozo en el evangelio de hoy: Fotina, que significa "iluminada" o "la que recibió [la] luz". Esto sigue la tradición bíblica de otorgar nombres a personajes para ayudarnos a entender su papel —y el nuestro— al experimentar el poder salvífico de Dios. Todos los evangelistas, y Juan en particular, hacen de los personajes que encuentran a Jesús prototipos de todos nosotros. Al igual que nosotros, Fotina no entiende al principio. Se requiere un diálogo con Jesús (en este caso, uno más bien argumentativo), para que esta mujer admita a sí misma quién es ella, y para que Jesús la ayude a descubrir dónde puede encontrar el verdadero manantial de agua viva y eterna. Al final de este encuentro ella queda iluminada. Su iluminación es la razón por la cual la Iglesia primitiva eligió éste como uno de los evangelios que siempre se deben leer para aquellos que buscan a Cristo por primera vez y que serán iluminados e iniciados en la nueva luz de la Vigilia Pascual.

¿PONER O NO PONER NOMBRE?

El mencionar por nombre a la mujer junto al pozo ha caído en desuso. En cierto modo, y especialmente en nuestra sociedad, se tiende a poner nombre a las cosas con el fin primordial de poseerlas. Las personas suelen poner nombre a sus mascotas, casas, automóviles y demás. Era parte de la tradición bíblica que el dar o cambiar el nombre a alguien demostraba que pertenecían a Dios; pero su nombre nuevo se escogía también para imbuirle la realidad de un cambio o una nueva dirección en su vida. Con mucha frecuencia, hoy nombramos cosas sólo para demostrar que nos pertenecen; así es que, tal vez es mejor que ya no le demos nombre a esta mujer, ya que bien pudiera ser el nombre de cualquiera de nosotros, mujer u hombre. Todos nosotros recibimos en nuestro bautismo un mismo nombre, el cual denota que somos de Cristo. Somos "cristi-anizados" y a lo largo de nuestra vida llevamos nuestro nombre más importante: cristiano o cristiana. La Cuaresma es un tiempo para retornar a ese nombre, para renovar nuestro diálogo con Cristo, y así ser, una vez más, iluminados por la gracia de su verdad y de su amor.

That is one way to experience the "living water" that Jesus offered the woman at the well. The woman tells Jesus, "The water is deep." So, too, are our souls. And in the practice of contemplative prayer, the grace of God flows through us like clear and cleansing water. That wellspring is always there if we make the effort to dip into it by quieting ourselves and entering into contemplation. Check out a good book on contemplation, like one of those by Thomas Keating.

SOLEMNITY OF JOSEPH, SPOUSE OF THE BLESSED VIRGIN MARY

Strong, silent type

Joseph never uttered a word in scripture. Instead he let his actions speak for what was going on in his heart. By his actions we know that Joseph not only believed in God but listened for God's promptings and was willing to be led—even to some confusing and difficult places. If you have trouble keeping an open mind, pray to Saint Joseph, who was so confident in God that he was willing to let go of the reins and let God lead the way. Saint Joseph proved always eager to help those who call on him for help.

LENTEN WEEKDAY

Give what you want

Jesus' entire ministry was grounded in love and forgiveness, yet often enough those who call themselves followers of Jesus fail to offer love and forgiveness to others. Instead, they nurture their grudges, hurts, and resentments, keeping them alive and in the present by retelling themselves the same old stories where it's everybody else's fault. Lent is a good time to practice abstaining from this habit. When you find yourself wanting to judge and blame others, turn your gaze inward. How often have you refused to give what you so dearly wish to receive?

TODAY'S READINGS: *Daniel 3:25, 34-43; Matthew 18:21-35* (238). *"Moved with compassion the master . . . let him go and forgave him the loan."*

LENTEN WEEKDAY

Do you believe in what you do?

For the past several years National Public Radio has broadcast a series of inspiring essays called *This I Believe*. Each essay is a statement of the core principles that guide the everyday life of the writer. In one memorable essay Sister Helen Prejean, C.S.J., author of *Dead Man Walking*, writes that she watches "what I do to see what I actually believe." She knows

it's one thing to say what you believe and quite another to live it. Today ask yourself: What principles guide my life? For inspiration visit thisibelieve.org.

MEMORIAL OF TURIBIUS OF MOGROVEJO, BISHOP

"Your mission, should you choose to accept it"

Each episode of the *Mission Impossible* TV series began with an agent getting his assignment from a tape-recorded message that included the words "your mission, should you choose to accept it." One can imagine a similar scene in 1580 when Saint Turibius, who was teaching law, was told by his bishop, "Congratulations, you're the new archbishop of Lima," a 170,000 square-mile diocese. Turibius spent the rest of his life arduously visiting the mostly indigenous population of his vast territory in Peru. Everyone has a mission from God. Choose to accept it.

FRIDAY, MARCH 24

LENTEN WEEKDAY; DAY OF ABSTINENCE

Why do we abstain from meat?

When food choices were far less varied than they are today, abstaining from meat was a definite disruption in one's daily meal routine and a sacrifice. The practice of abstinence is intended to reduce our attachments to the normal and the expected so that we might be open to the many other ways God nourishes us. The issue is not the meat, but rather our attachments. Orthodox Bishop Kallistos Ware writes, "Evil resides not in created things as such, but in our attitude toward them, that is, our will. The purpose of fasting, then, is not to repudiate the divine creation but to cleanse our will."

TODAY'S READINGS: *Hosea 14:2-10; Mark 12:28-34* (241). *"You are not far from the kingdom of God."*

SATURDAY, MARCH 25

SOLEMNITY OF THE ANNUNCIATION OF THE LORD

Free to consent or refuse

Mary's acceptance of God's proposal is electrifying because she was free to say no. God gives all of us free will, but people often take it from others to oppress and use them. On this feast of Annunciation, we remember victims of slavery. In four centuries of the transatlantic slave trade, 15 million Africans were brought to the New World: four for every European who came to the Americas. Today, many millions of men, women, and children are enslaved in manual labor and prostitution worldwide. See freetheslaves.net for what you can do to make freedom ring.

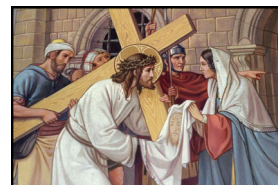
