OTHER CHILDREN OF THE LIGHT

Some early Christians gave the woman at the well from last week's Gospel the name "Photina," which means "she who has received light." We hear another story from John's Gospel today about someone who receives light, is enlightened. The man blind from birth receives the light of Christ by having the barrier of his blindness removed. In Jesus' day, being blind from birth was an important distinction to make: if one were blinded by an accident, it was not necessarily viewed as God's displeasure with one's sinfulness. But birth blindness was thought of as a sign of sinfulness, even a sign of the sinfulness of the individual's parents. Jesus breached the religious code and teaching of his day twice: by removing the obstacle purportedly placed there by God as a sign of the presence of sin, and doing so by committing the "sin" of working on the Sabbath, making mud to heal the blind man.

LIVING AS CHILDREN OF THE LIGHT

After the man born blind was healed, he could have done any number of things. He could have used his newly-received sight for good or for ill, or he could have just said "thanks" and gone on his way. When we receive the light of Christ in baptism, as well as God's anointing Spirit (as does David in today's first reading), we join the community of faith that professes Jesus Christ as the Light from Light, true God from true God. We are part of the Body of Christ—the church—who glorify God and worship Christ, as does the man born blind today. But we are called upon to do more. Ephesians tells us that we, who were blind but now see, are called to live, day by day, as children of that light. We don't just say "thanks" for our baptism. Rather, our vocation is to live out that thanks by doing deeds of light, by spreading the gospel of the joy, justice, beauty, and peace we find in Jesus. This is one of the intentions of our Lenten disciplines, to help us leave behind the deeds of darkness and to live out the light of the Good News.

OTROS HIJOS DE LA LUZ

Algunos de los primeros cristianos dieron a la mujer que estaba junto al pozo en el evangelio de la semana pasada el nombre de "Fotina", que significa "la que recibió luz". Hoy escuchamos otro relato del Evangelio según san Juan en el que alguien recibe luz, o sea, es iluminado. El hombre ciego de nacimiento recibe la luz de Cristo cuando desaparece el impedimento de su ceguera. En tiempos de Jesús se hacía una importante distinción si la persona era ciega de nacimiento, pues, si uno quedaba ciego por accidente, no necesariamente se consideraba como castigo de Dios por los pecados de uno; por otro lado, se creía que la ceguera de nacimiento era señal de pecaminosidad y hasta señal de la pecaminosidad de los padres de la persona. Jesús rompió dos veces el código y la enseñanza religiosa de su tiempo al remover el impedimento, erróneamente creído impuesto por Dios como señal de pecado, y cuando "cometió el pecado" de hacer barro para devolver la vista al ciego en día sábado.

VIVIR COMO HIJOS DE LA LUZ

Después de ser sanado, el ciego de nacimiento pudo haber hecho varias cosas. Pudo haber usado su reciente adquirida vista para bien o para mal, o pudo simplemente haber dicho "gracias" y continuar su camino. Cuando recibimos la luz de Cristo en el bautismo, así como la unción del Espíritu de Dios (como David en la primera lectura de hoy), nos unimos a la comunidad de fe que profesa a Jesucristo como Luz de Luz y Dios verdadero de Dios verdadero. Somos parte del Cuerpo de Cristo —la Iglesia— que glorifica a Dios y adora a Cristo, como lo hace hoy el hombre ciego de nacimiento. Sin embargo, somos llamados a hacer más. La carta a los efesios nos dice que nosotros, que fuimos ciegos mas ahora vemos, somos llamados a vivir diariamente como hijos e hijas de la luz. No meramente decimos "gracias" por nuestro bautismo. Más bien, nuestra vocación es vivir esa gratitud al hacer las obras de la luz, al compartir el evangelio de gozo, justicia, belleza y paz que encontramos en Jesús. Ésta es una de las intenciones de las disciplinas de la Cuaresma, para ayudarnos a dejar atrás las obras de la oscuridad y vivir a la luz de la Buena Noticia.

What’s done is done

An inexhaustible source of human unhappiness is the tendency to recall and relive painful past events. In no time at all you can find yourself digging up regrettable past events, painful memories, and long-held resentments. Fortunately spring reminds us that God is forever looking forward. Bulbs are ready to burst forth. New blades of grass emerge. Buds appear on tree branches. All of creation moves forward; shouldn’t you as well?

TODAY’S READINGS: *Isaiah 65:17-21; John 4:43-54 (244)*. “The things of the past shall not be remembered or come to mind.”

LENTEN WEEKDAY

Put on your walking shoes

If it has been a while since you took a walk, this is a reminder that walking has much to commend it! There are the well-documented physical benefits of course, but walking offers powerful spiritual rewards as well. Something about the rhythm of breathing and movement quiets and clears the mind. Before you know it, you are free of repetitive, unhelpful thought patterns. You open to new ideas and fresh perspectives. Often a profound sense of optimism sets in. A good walk also can induce prayer. Saint Augustine summed it up best when he wrote, “*Solvitur ambulando*”: “It is solved by walking.”

TODAY’S READINGS: *Ezekiel 47:1-9, 12; John 5:1-16 (245)*. “Take up your mat and walk.”

LENTEN WEEKDAY

Do you get the message?

Before any gospel was written, the apostles preached a nugget of faith we call the *kerygma*—the “proclamation”:

Jesus Christ . . . rose from the dead, and was raised to God’s right hand in heaven. Faith in this Good News will bring you salvation. It takes all of Lent to absorb this heady message and what it means to be baptized into Christ. We enter the season and the heart of the Good News with fresh eyes and ears, as if the daffodils sprouting around us had never been seen before, as if Jesus were the new beauty and new fragrance in the air.

TODAY’S READINGS: *Isaiah 49:8-15; John 5:17-30 (246)*.

THURSDAY, MARCH 30

LENTEN WEEKDAY

Give us your best imitation of Christ

Jesus was not interested in human praise because he saw that there is often an element of self-interest in praising others. But imitation? That’s a different kind of praise—the highest form—and Jesus was on board with that kind. He calls you to follow him, to imitate him, in thought, word, and deed, rather than merely pay him lip service. We gather together in worship not because that is sufficient to fulfill our calling but to gather strength and support to follow through on our vocation once we walk out the church doors. Do your best imitation of Jesus today!

TODAY’S READINGS: *Exodus 32:7-14; John 5:31-47 (247)*.

Uncovering the cornerstone

Though we’d like to think the cornerstone of our life is our faith, the actual foundation of our lives may be something far less permanent. Maybe our world pivots on one person, whose existence is as precarious as ours. Maybe our trust is really in our bank account, our career or position, our power of attraction or personal cleverness. Those things may sustain us through a lot of hard times, but they can also change overnight. Jesus Christ is the same yesterday, today, and forever. No one and nothing is more reliable.

TODAY’S READINGS: *Wisdom 2:1a, 12-22; John 7:1-2, 10, 25-30 (248)*. “The one who sent me, whom you do not know, is true.”

LENTEN WEEKDAY

Dare we fiddle with tradition?

As Tevye reminds us in *Fiddler on the Roof*, there is something to be said for tradition. At the same time there needs to be room for innovation as well, lest rich traditions become ossified museum pieces. Jesus was a radical trailblazer, much to the distress of the Jewish community’s deeply entrenched leadership. A living faith such as Christianity must seek anew with every generation the proper mix of tradition and change. Be part of the conversation in your own faith community by getting involved, listening and learning from others, and letting your own voice be heard.

Little Disciple Learning Center & Universal Pre-K

For the 2017-18 school year, the White Plains Public Schools will collaborate with several White Plains early childhood agencies to provide a free Universal Prekindergarten Program to four-year olds (children born in the year 2013) who reside in the City of White Plains. Transportation is not provided. They will offer half-day classes as well as a limited number of full-day classes. Preference for full-day spaces will be given to families who meet specific income criteria. If there are more eligible children than there are spaces available for the full-day slots, a lottery will be held and children who are not chosen in the lottery will be placed in a half-day class and on a Waiting List for full day.

They expect to follow the timetable below:

- Week of March 27th- They will mail parents and post on the website: a list of collaborating agencies, information about how to apply for Universal Pre-kindergarten and an application form.
- April 21th - Applications are due at the Family Information Center, 500 North Street.
- Third week of May - Prekindergarten assignments will be made and parents will be notified of the assignment for their child.
- First week of June- Early childhood agencies will contact parents whose children will be attending their program to make an appointment for them to come into the agency and complete their child's registration.
