First Sunday of Lent

First Sunday of Lent

THE RESPONSE OF GOD

This year the Sunday scriptures of Lent have their genesis in the book of Genesis. We hear the second of the two versions of the creation story that open this book. Today's account—in which Adam receives life and Eve is created from his side—is the version filled with more folk-parable types of details, with God a much more involved character in the drama. When God wanted to change lifeless clay into a being made in the divine image, it was through breath. That breath (in Hebrew the *ruach* or wind or spirit of God) is the sign and source of humanity's intimate connection with our Creator. Adam experiences *con spire*: a "breathing with" God. Adam and Eve are in the best sense made con-spirators with God's plan for creation. But when he and Eve decide to conspire against the divine will and not with it, they fall out of their intimate relationship with God. At first, it seems that God's response is punishment; but Christians believe that God's ultimate response to this fallen state is a gift: Jesus Christ.

THE RESPONSE OF CHRIST

We commonly call today's Gospel "The Temptation in the Desert" but it more accurately might be called "The Triumph in the Desert." The Gospels are filled with stories in which Jesus is triumphant, in which he faces evil, enemies, adversity. All of these prey on his human nature and seek to make him cease breathing with the spirit of God's will. But each time Jesus prevails, and in prevailing gives glory to God. Each of these triumphs is a small prefiguring of the Resurrection. And it is the Resurrection for which Lent prepares us. It is a time when we remember that the very breath of Christ, bestowed on his followers after his resurrection, was also bestowed on us by the Spirit of baptism. It is that Spirit, that baptismal breath of Christ, that we must draw upon to strengthen us in our trials, that our temptations will be vanquished by the will of God. In our failings remembered, we ask forgiveness. In our triumphs through Christ, we give glory to God.

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Primer Domingo de Cuaresma

LA RESPUESTA DE DIOS

Este año las lecturas de los domingos de Cuaresma se originan en el libro del Génesis. Escuchamos la segunda de las dos versiones del relato de la creación que se encuentra al inicio de este libro. El relato de hoy —en el cual Adán recibe la vida y Eva es creada de su costado— es la versión más detallada, con ese estilo de parábola popular que muestra a Dios como un personaje mucho más involucrado en el drama. Cuando Dios quiso transformar la inerte arcilla en un ser hecho a la imagen divina, lo hizo soplando sobre él. Ese aliento (en hebreo *ruah*, viento o espíritu de Dios) es el signo y la fuente del íntimo vínculo de la humanidad con nuestro Creador. Adán experimenta un *con spire*, un "respirar con" Dios. En el mejor de los sentidos, a Adán y Eva se les hace conspiradores con el plan de Dios para la creación. Pero cuando Adán y Eva deciden conspirar contra la voluntad divina en vez de cooperar con ella, se rompe su relación íntima con Dios. Al principio, parece que la respuesta de Dios es de castigo; pero los cristianos creen que la respuesta final de Dios ante este estado de caída es un don: Jesucristo.

LA RESPUESTA DE CRISTO

Solemos llamar al evangelio de hoy "la tentación en el desierto", pero sería más acertado llamarlo "el triunfo en el desierto". Los evangelios están repletos de relatos en los que Jesús sale triunfante, donde enfrenta al mal, a los enemigos y a la adversidad. Todos éstos acechan su naturaleza humana y buscan lograr hacerlo cesar de respirar con el espíritu de la voluntad de Dios. Sin embargo, Jesús prevalece una y otra vez, y al hacerlo da gloria a Dios. Cada uno de estos triunfos es una pequeña prefiguración de la resurrección. La Cuaresma nos prepara para la resurrección. Es el tiempo en que recordamos que el mismo aliento de Cristo, su Espíritu que sopló sobre sus discípulos después de su resurrección, también sopló sobre nosotros en nuestro bautismo. Es ese Espíritu, ese aliento bautismal de Cristo, al que debemos recurrir para fortalecernos en nuestras pruebas, para que nuestras tentaciones sean vencidas por la voluntad de Dios. Al recordar nuestras faltas, pedimos perdón. Al reconocer nuestros triunfos, por Cristo, damos gloria a Dios.

Talking to the devil

Temptation is part of the human story, as unavoidable as original sin. Each of us regularly spends a few moments chatting with the devil about the weaknesses that haunt us the most. Should we have another piece of cake or another drink? Why not leave work early (no one's watching) or say that unkind remark (it will never get back to her) or tell that lie (it will make you look better)? To fortify yourself against those little chats so potentially destructive to integrity, why not spend a few minutes each day in conversation with the Lord? Prayer is the best-known antidote to temptation.

TODAY'S READINGS: *Genesis 2:7-9; 3:1-7; Romans 5:12-19; Matthew 4:1-11* (22). "Jesus was led by the Spirit into the desert."

MONDAY, MARCH 6

LENTEN WEEKDAY

Less is more

Possessions might seem like blessings but can end up being burdens, and many saints went to great lengths to empty their pockets in order to lighten their hearts. Case in point: Sixth-century Brigid of Kildare, who enraged her Druid dad by giving to the needy everything that wasn't nailed down. When a nobleman tried to stop her chariot, she charged his blockage, surviving but totaling her chariot. Finally her father decided to sell her at market, but she entered a monastery instead. Give in to the spirit of generosity—and you just might find that the new lighter you can't get enough of less.

TODAY'S READINGS: *Leviticus 19:1-2, 11-18; Matthew 25:31-46* (24). "For I was hungry and you gave me food, I was thirsty and you gave me drink."

TUESDAY, MARCH 7

MEMORIAL OF PERPETUA AND FELICITY, MARTYRS

I am what I am

In 203 A.D., a time of persecution of Christians, 22-year-old Vibia Perpetua put her life in danger by converting. Her father tried to persuade her of the danger of such a move. Perpetua pointed to a water jug, asking, "Do you see that pot lying there? Can you call it by any other name than what it is?" Her father said, "Of course not." Perpetua replied, "Neither can I call myself by any other name than what I am—a Christian." She and her friend, Felicity, didn't let others define who they were or what they believed—even at the risk of death. It takes courage to remain true to one's Baptism, even in the face of much less extreme challenges. Remember the example of these women and stay strong in your faith.

TODAY'S READINGS: *Isaiah 55:10-11; Matthew 6:7-15* (25). "Your Father knows what you need before you ask him."

WEDNESDAY, MARCH 8

MEMORIAL OF JOHN OF GOD, RELIGIOUS

It's no trouble

What might be your first thought about a person described as a wanderer, an alcoholic, and a psychiatric patient? "Saint" would probably not be the word, and yet today's memorial celebrates a person who, despite many struggles throughout his life, oriented himself to God. Saint John of God's experiences—which often left him as an outcast in society—were transformed through the grace of God and John's willingness to be transformed by this grace. He opened not only his heart but his door to helping others who were

in difficulty, eventually founding the Hospitaller Order in Granada, Spain. How might your own struggles in life be an opportunity for grace?

TODAY'S READINGS: *Jonah 3:1-10; Luke 11:29-32* (26). "In the greatness of your compassion wipe out my offense."

LENTEN WEEKDAY

The original super girl

Looking for teen superheroes? During Women's History Month, look no further than the Book of Esther. A Jewess orphaned in Persia, Esther was raised by a sympathetic uncle. A kingdom-wide beauty contest obliged her to audition for the position of next Queen of Persia. She didn't want to be queen, and she didn't want to be exposed as Jewish—since Jews were due to be systematically eliminated. Esther had no superpowers, but even an Everygirl can find in herself the courage to save a nation. Support the young Esthers you know!

TODAY'S READINGS: *Esther C:12, 14-16, 23-25; Matthew 7:7-12* (27). "Help me, who am alone and have no help but you, for I am taking my life in my hand."

FRIDAY, MARCH 10

LENTEN WEEKDAY; DAY OF ABSTINENCE

Fast with a light heart

Fasting is a spiritual practice acknowledged across religions. Muslims respect it as a way to grow in compassion for the needy. Jews see it as a way to heighten awareness of God's many gifts and broaden periods of self-denial to include refraining from bathing, sexual relations, and wearing leather shoes (once considered a luxury). Synagogue attendees could show up feeling quite grubby—and grumpy—for certain observances. We might keep in mind the fourth-century monk John Cassian's warning: "What we gain from fasting does not compensate us for what we lose through anger." Food for thought!

TODAY'S READINGS: *Ezekiel 18:21-28; Matthew 5:20-26* (28). "Settle with your opponent quickly while on the way to court."

Honk if you love your enemies

Surely Jesus' most radical command is to love our enemies. But exactly how are we supposed to do that? One way to begin is by learning from the example of others. A man was waiting in his car at the window of a drive-up Starbucks. His order was taking some time and eventually the person behind him began impatiently blowing his horn. Instead of becoming angry himself, the first man paid for the second one's order and drove away. With this profoundly simple but powerful act, he turned a negative interaction into a positive one and changed the other man's day. Today may we pray to offer a loving response to anyone who tries to cause us grief.

TODAY'S READINGS: *Deuteronomy 26:16-19; Matthew 5:43-48* (29). "For if you love those who love you, what reward do you have?"

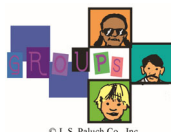


The Young Adult Group

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**Mayor Roach's statement on the
President's executive order:**

The City of White Plains is a diverse, vibrant and welcoming community. As Mayor, protecting the rights of all those who live, work, and visit here is paramount.

In White Plains we recognize that immigration is part of our national story. It was an immigrant, Alexander Hamilton, whose command of artillery held off British and Hessian troops during the Battle of White Plains, allowing General Washington to preserve his army, and ultimately, our nation. The contributions of immigrants to our city and our nation have continued to this day.

The recent executive order issued by President Trump regarding "sanctuary cities" is of great concern. There is no clear definition of what constitutes a "sanctuary city" and therefore we do not adopt that term in White Plains. We believe it is more helpful to discuss our actual policies:

- Our police officers have not and will not inquire regarding an individual's immigration status.
- We believe enforcement of federal immigration law lies with federal enforcement agencies not local police forces and we proceed accordingly.
- We adhere to the practices outlined by Attorney General Schneiderman in his recently issued guidance to local governments. We were pleased to have been consulted during the drafting of those guidelines.

Our practices represent proper community policing, focused on building and maintaining trust and cooperation between the police and the community. Studies have demonstrated that these policies reduce crime and create a safer environment for all.

All of our policies are in compliance with the law and the Constitution and we are prepared to defend them in a court of law if necessary. We are proud of our policies and will continue to protect the rights of all those within our borders.

**Declaración del Alcalde Roach en respuesta
a la Orden Ejecutiva del Presidente:**

La Ciudad de White Plains es una comunidad diversa, vibrante y hospitalaria. Como Alcalde, el proteger los derechos de todos aquellos que viven, trabajan y visitan esta ciudad es de suma importancia.

En White Plains reconocemos que la inmigración es parte de la historia nuestra. Fue un inmigrante, Alexander Hamilton, quien con su comando de la artillería resistió a las tropas británicas y de Hesse durante la Batalla de White Plains, permitiéndole al General Washington, conservar su ejército y, ultimadamente, nuestra nación. Las contribuciones de inmigrantes a nuestra ciudad y nuestra nación han continuado hasta el día de hoy.

La reciente orden ejecutiva emitida por el Presidente Trump en referencia a las "ciudades santuario" es de gran preocupación. No hay una definición clara acerca de lo que constituye una "ciudad santuario" y por lo tanto nosotros no adoptamos ese término en White Plains. Creemos que es más útil el discutir nuestras políticas actuales:

- Nuestros oficiales de la Policía no han preguntado, ni preguntarán acerca del estatus migratorio de un individuo.
- Creemos que la aplicación de la ley Federal de Inmigración recae sobre los organismos policiales federales y no sobre las fuerzas policiales locales, y procedemos de acuerdo a esto.
- Nos adherimos a las prácticas descritas por el Procurador General Schneiderman en su guía a los gobiernos locales publicada recientemente. Nos complace haber sido consultados durante la redacción de esta directriz.

Nuestras prácticas representan una apropiada política policial de acercamiento a la comunidad, enfocada en construir y mantener la confianza y cooperación entre la policía y la comunidad. Estudios han demostrado que estas políticas reducen el crimen y crean un ambiente más seguro para todos.

Todas nuestras políticas están en conformidad a la ley y a la Constitución y estamos preparados para defenderlas en un tribunal de justicia si es necesario. Estamos orgullosos de nuestras políticas y continuaremos protegiendo los derechos de todos aquellos dentro de nuestras fronteras.
